



DANA FARM ICE SKATING RINK

The Dana Farm Ice Skating Rink, a project primarily funded with a generous donation from Kewaunee County Farm Technology Days 2017, is an outdoor ice rink that is FREE to use during the months of January and February or as long as the ice is in good condition.

The ice rink, which is located at N3787 Ransom Moore Lane, Kewaunee and adjacent to Winter Park, is typically open to the public seven days a week from the hours of 9am - 8pm and it is lighted for night skating.

Visitors must bring their own skates, rentals are not available. The ice rink is unsupervised, so it is use at your own risk, and the Kewaunee County Promotions & Recreation Department asks that visitors be patient if staff needs to clear snow from the ice.

There is a park shelter with public restrooms that can be used year round, which includes those taking advantage of the 18-hole disc golf course that winds around Winter Park during the warmer months.

WINTER PARK

Winter Park is best known for snow tubing, skiing, snowboarding, and snowshoeing. The park is typically open to the public on the weekends during the months of January and February.

The snow tubing hill features five lanes approximately 450 feet long with a vertical drop of 70 feet. Getting to the top of the hill is easy as riders can hop on a "Magic Carpet", a standing conveyor belt system that transports visitors up with their tubes in approximately two



minutes. Snow tube riders are required to be at least 42" tall for safety reasons.

The skiing/snowboarding area has five runs some over a quarter mile in length with a 160 foot vertical drop with a T-bar lift that brings skiers and snowboarders to the top. There is also a beginner's hill for those just learning the sport that is equipped with a tow rope lift system.

Visitors are also invited to snowshoe around the park's trail system for FREE.

Winter Park offers ski, snowboard and snowshoe equipment rentals and has a warming chalet with concessions, public restrooms, tables, chairs and storage cubbies.

Winter Park also doubles as a 18-hole disc golf course during spring, summer and fall. It's rated eighth in the state by Disc Golf Course Reviews. The scenic course covers the entire park. You'll find a donation tube located at the park for upkeep.

KEWAUNEE PARKS

- **A. Lighthouse/Don & Jean Smith Memorial Park** Gateway to a walk out to the Lighthouse, the park offers a magnificent view of Lake Michigan. At the entrance to the park is an anchor in memoriam to those who went down with the Barge, Emerald, on November 16, 1886, during the Dickinson and Emerald Disaster. Benefactors of the park are the philanthropists Donald L. and Jean M. Smith.
- **C. Father Marquette Park** The Park marks the spot where Father Marquette offered the Holy Sacrifice of Mass to commemorate his visit to these shores on November 11, 1674. This two- acre park with its magnificent view of Lake Michigan is located in the outer harbor area, protected by the harbor breakwaters. It offers active playground equipment, a pavilion structure, and restroom facilities.
- **D. Harbor Point Park** Harbor Point Park is located at the end of Hathaway Drive and offers a lovely view of the city of Kewaunee, its harbor, and Tug Ludington. Enjoy the peacefulness of this pretty park which offers many benches and picnic tables and the opportunity to fish.
- **E.** Ahnapee Trail, Grandfather Clock, Fire Museum Park Located across from the harbor is a park that marks The Ahnapee State Trail, that is the location for the Grandfather Clock and the Fire Museum, and that serves as the local Farmer's Market in summer.

The Ahnapee State Trail covers 30 miles connecting Kewaunee, Luxemburg, Casco, Algoma, and Sturgeon Bay. The trail is open in spring, summer, fall, and winter for hikers, bikers, snowmobilers, and more.

- **F. Pioneer Park** Located across from the Vollrath Company, the park provides picnic tables, restrooms, and an easy walking access to the sandy beach on Lake Michigan.
- **F. Harbor Park** Enjoy the Kewaunee ambiance at Harbor Park where you can watch sailboats and fishing vessels set out for Lake Michigan and take a tour of the Tug Ludington, one of the tugs that participated in the D-Day invasion of Normandy.

On Sundays in summer, Harbor Park is the site of Music in the Park. Pull up a lawn chair and experience some of the best music on the Lakeshore. And on winter days, Harbor Park is the site of a Christmas tree wonderland, lit up for the holiday season.

Every day, no matter the season take the opportunity to admire the sculpture at the entrance to the park. "Bring Forth Sturgeon" honors Kewaunee's historical bond with the Menominee Nation. The sculpture, sponsored by the Kewaunee Rotary, depicts two Menominee Braves fishing for sturgeon and is the creation of a local artist, Dr. Bill Faller.

G. Selner Park Only a few blocks from Kewaunee's downtown, this picturesque park sits atop the hill overlooking Lake Michigan and the Kewaunee Public Beach. The park offers swings and a slide for children and plenty of shade trees to enjoy sitting on the benches and at the picnic tables. The park provides a parking lot and two short boardwalks leading out to the sandy beach and swimming area.

- **H. Haney Park** Haney Park has a baseball/softball field available to the public and for leagues. The Park may be flooded in the winter to create a public ice-skating rink.
- **J. Kewaunee Memorial and Kieweg Park** Kewaunee Memorial Park is located on Lincoln Street across from the American Legion and offers residents a lighted baseball diamond and soccer field. It connects to the shady, picturesque Kieweg Park which provides a quiet space for families to entertain their children on slides, swings, and more.
- **K. Kewaunee County Bruemmer Park Zoo** Bruemmer Park is located 2 miles west of Kewaunee where City C intersects with County F. The Park features a small zoo, a large playground, wooded trails, pavilions, and borders the Kewaunee River.
- **L. Winter Park** Winter Park is located at N3787 Ransom Moore Lane and is typically open to the public on weekends during the months of January and February. The Park offers ski, snowboard and snowshoe equipment rentals and has a warming chalet. See page 19.
- **M. The Arboretum** The Arboretum established in 2005 is located by the Water Tower on State Highway 29 at the western Kewaunee City limits. Enjoy this environmental resource dedicated to the native trees of Wisconsin.

MARQUETTE HISTORICAL DISTRICT

The Marquette Historic District is a distinctive residential neighborhood of fine homes located within the heart of Kewaunee. The Marquette Historic District, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places, consists of forty-three homes. Take a self-guided walking tour on the city streets to experience these showcased homes built in the late 1880's through the early 1900's by some of Kewaunee's most prominent businessmen. Expect to find a variety of Italianate, Second Empire, Queen Anne, Craftsman, Prairie, American Foursquare, and various Period Revival styles of architecture.

Guidebooks are available for purchase at the Chamber Tourist Information Center. This tour is well worth your time!






HISTORIC DOWNTOWN WALKING TOUR

Grandfather Clock Kewaunee boasts the world's largest grandfather clock at 35' 10", originally built by Svobboda Industries in 1976 for the U.S. Bicentennial Celebration.

Tug Ludington The Ludington, christened the Major Wilbur F. Browder, participated in the D-Day invasion and continued to assist in harbor operations. In 1947, the tug was stationed in Kewaunee by the Army Corps of Engineers.

Railroad Depot Built in the 1890s, the Depot accommodated passenger service from the Green Bay and Western Railroad between Kewaunee and Green Bay; a spur from Kewaunee led to Door County.

Life Saving Station Originally built in 1893, the Life Saving Station was one of many that served as the precursor to U.S. Coast Guard working tirelessly to save lives in a growing shipping industry. The station continued under the Coast Guard until its closure in 1947.

HISTORIC DOWNTOWN WALKING TOUR

Kewaunee Lighthouse As Kewaunee became an increasingly vital port connecting Wisconsin and the Midwest to the Eastern U.S., the Lighthouse served as the centerpiece to assist incoming and outgoing ships.

Priebe Cold Storage (Port 0' Call Restaurant) The Priebe Cheese Cold Storage building, built in 1935 replacing the old Crosby and Meyers Cheese House that formerly occupied this site.

Emerald and Dickinson The coal barges, Emerald and Disckinson, sank off the coast of Lake Michigan near Kewaunee on November 17, 1885 leading to the construction of the Life Saving Station.

Light Plant In 1892, a group of citizens requested streetlights from the city council. In 1895, an ordinance was passed to construct an electric light plant. The light plant was finally built in 1908, and Kewaunee got electric lights.

Lakehaven Hall Part of the Hamachek Machine Company established in 1898, included a foundry, planing mill, machine shop and lumber warehouse.

Karsten Hotel In 1858, the Steamboat House was built on the current Karsten Hotel site, serving as a major hub for social activities. On February 14th, 1912, a fire destroyed the building. The hotel is claimed to be home to three spirits: William Karsten, the former owner; Billy Karsten III, his grandson; and Agatha, a maid who had worked and lived at the hotel.

Doctor's Office Considered the oldest doctor's office in Wisconsin, it was built in 1873. Dr. Oliver Martin began practice in Kewaunee on March 2, 1874. It was also the site of the first volunteer-type lending library

Kewaunee Bottling Company (Kewaunee Artisans Center) The Kewaunee Bottling Company aka Pop Shop began in 1919 with one truck and a horse-drawn sled. The company distributed a variety of beers and manufactured Double Cola, Bubble Up, Squirt, Baumeister Root Beer, Orange, Cherry and Cream sodas.

Parkos Mobil This Tudor revival-style Walden Service Station opened in 1931. In 1976, it was sold to Parkos Oil and remains a service station today.





Goodrich Dock The Goodrich boats traveled the Lake Michigan waters in the late 1800s carrying cargo and passengers. Docking in this area, they were near Wanninger's Pea Factory and Seyk's Grain Elevator.

USS Pueblo Between 1941 and 1946, Kewaunee Shipbuilding and Engineering delivered 80 vessels to the U.S. Government. Its most newsworthy ship was the USS Pueblo when, on January 23,1968, she was captured by the North Koreans; the crew and her captain were accused of espionage.







BESADNY ANADROMOUS FISHERY



Where Salmon Eggs are Turned Into Salmon

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) operates a fish egg collection station near the City of Kewaunee. The WDNR's Besadny Anadromous Fisheries Facility (BAFF) is nestled in a secluded area along a quiet, scenic stretch of the Kewaunee River. Trout and salmon migrating from Lake Michigan are led by flowing water past two underwater viewing windows to a fish

ladder - a series of waterfall-like steps - that leads to six collection ponds. Fish are moved from the ponds through the spawning process in the building and back to the river - upstream of the barrier dam - to continue their upstream migration.

History in the Making

Trout and salmon have been stocked into Lake Michigan since the early 1960's. Prior to the construction of BAFF, WDNR has relied, at least in part, on other agencies for eggs and/or fish of several species or strains to maintain the trout and salmon



sport fishery in Wisconsin waters of Lake Michigan. BAFF is designed to serve as a collection station for trout and salmon eggs but the staff there also hatch and raise both lake sturgeon and spotted musky for stocking into Lake Michigan and Green Bay respectively. Additionally, BAFF provides a scenic place for the general public to observe migrating fish and to learn about fisheries and other WDNR programs through tours and educational programs offered by the facility.



BESADNY ANADROMOUS FISHERY

Why We Do the Things We Do

The primary objective of the WDNR trout and salmon stocking program for Lake Michigan is to provide a diverse sport fishery for anglers. Each year WDNR stocks millions of trout and salmon into Lake Michigan tributary streams to provide a put-grow-and-take in the lake and sport fishery in the tributary streams. Since most Wisconsin tributary streams lack the potential to support adequate natural reproduction, adult trout and salmon must be collected each year and spawned. Their progeny are raised in hatcheries and stocked back into the tributaries to complete the cycle.

When Can We See the Fish Jumping?

BAFF operates from March through December with exact dates dependent upon spawning migrations of the various fish species. For specific days either see our electronic display sign in the building lobby or call the number listed below. Migration times for the spring steelhead occur from early March through early May. The chinook salmon run begins in mid-September and continues through mid-November. The fall coho salmon run occurs from mid-September through late October. Seeforellen brown trout begin to enter the stream by mid-October and continue to run until the river ices up in late December.

Hours of Operation

The Besadny Fisheries Facility is open to the public for viewing every day of the year during daylight hours. Fish are not always present. However, general spawning migration periods are listed above. Please call the number listed below if you need more information. Special group tours are available and can be arranged by calling the Besadny Facility manager at 920-388-1025. Information and educational displays also lead visitors on a self guided tour and provide basic information on trout and salmon life history, facility operation, and other related subjects.

TUG LUDINGTON



Made for WWII, the Tug Ludington was built at Jacobson Shipyard in Oyster Bay, New York. In February of 1943 the keel was laid and the tug was finally finished in October of that same year.

The U.S. Army accepted and christened the tug "Major Wilbur F. Browder" and designated the tug LT-4. The tug's armament consisted of two 50 caliber machine guns mounted above the chartroom and pilothouse.

The tug participated in the D-Day invasion of Normandy, towing ammunition barges across the English Channel. After Normandy it traveled to Cherbourg, France to assist in harbor operations until being sent to Plymouth, England until the end of the war. After the war, it joined the U.S. Army Transportation Corps and returned to Norfolk, Virginia where it continued service along the eastern seaboard.

In 1947, the Corps Of Engineers transferred the tug to Kewaunee, WI and then renamed it the "Tug Ludington". While in Kewaunee it was used in the construction and maintenance of many harbors on the Great Lakes. The Tug has towed a wide variety of floating equipment. It is estimated that the Tug has hauled over 1 million tons of cargo.

The Tug now rests in Harbor Park in downtown Kewaunee and is open to visitors from June until Labor Day. The Tug is registered in the National and State Register of Historic Places.

Open May 15- October 15 from 7am to 4pm daily, weather permitting. Admission \$5 for adults \$3 for children. Children must be accompanied by an adult. The Tug Ludington is a self-guided tour with audio devices available.





KEWAUNEE FIRE DEPARTMENT MUSEUM



The Kewaunee Fire Museum has been built to preserve the rich history, heritage, and traditions of the fire service. The Kewaunee Museum has been newly constructed with the grateful assistance of volunteers, charitable support received from businesses and interested friends of the fire

department. The location of the museum can be found at the corner Milwaukee & Miller Street, right next door to the giant Grandfather Clock and Pavilion Park in downtown Kewaunee. The museum property is owned by the City of Kewaunee.

On display at the museum, you will find a collection of memorabilia about the history of the fire service as well as actual vintage firefighting equipment. There are many departmental group photos and scrap book pictures of the Kewaunee fire service. Taking us back into time is a display of the actual 1845

"Hand Tub" pumping engine #266 that was purchased by Kewaunee from the City of Milwaukee. Also on feature display is Kewaunee's firsthand pumper purchased back in 1884, a hand drawn hose reel and Kewaunee's first motorized pumping engine purchased new back in the year of 1927.



A retired Fire Chief by the name of Tom Check has added vintage fire equipment to our historical display. Tom collects fire memorabilia as a hobby and has recently relocated to Kewaunee. In his move here, he donated much of his fire collection to our museum. This collection consisted of outdoor vintage light posts, alarm boxes, telegraph stations, history books of the fire service, helmets and many other pieces of fire equipment not necessarily used in Kewaunee, however, operated by the larger communities throughout the United States. His collection greatly enhanced our museum display that will catch the interest of any visitor.

Our museum is operated by volunteers, and we do not have any set hours of operation. The museum building has large glass windows and glass garage doors for viewing from outdoors. If you would like an inside tour, call retired fire chief, Greg Hlinak at 920-255-1139 to schedule a time/date.

GRANDFATHER CLOCK



The 35' 10" tall grandfather clock in Kewaunee was built in 1976 (bi-centennial) by Svoboda Industries as a hallmark of their business and a gift to the people of Kewaunee. It was built by Jake Schlies with the help of his son, Rodney. In 1984, a new bridge was built in Kewaunee and Svoboda would move its business and the clock to their new Top of the Hill Shop located on Hwy 42 on the northeast edge of Kewaunee. Svoboda's closed the shop and the clock staved behind and was neglected for more than a decade before selling the property to the Kewaunee County Sherriff's Department in 2013. The clock would now be forced to relocate or be dismantled permanently

since the Sherriff's Department planned on using the building for storage. This created a whirlwind of excitement since other cities had interest in taking the clock out of Kewaunee to be restored and used.

Jason Jelinek began a grass root movement using local news outlets and social media to garner attention and support to save a historic piece of Kewaunee, but also a true Americana road side attraction. With full support of Sherriff Matt Joski and soon after Mayor John Blaha, approval to move the clock to its new home at the corner of Miller Street and Hwy 42/Milwaukee Street at the head of the Anhapee Trail was unanimously voted for by the city council in March 2013.

The clock was dismantled in June 2013 for restoration. The body, which was mostly made of redwood, was rotted and replaced with marine grade plywood. A new footing was poured and the steel I-beam backbone inside the clock had extra support struts welded in for bolting to the footing. The ornate clock head was restored through the winter mainly by Dale (Whitey) Vandermoss and his brother, Mike Vandermoss, whom recreated some of the large spindles, coved and crowned moldings by hand. While the outside was being repaired, the

German made motors of the clock were looked over by Hacker Berkovitz and made sure they were all keeping time.

On August 27, 2014, the clock body and head were raised in its current home downtown Kewaunee facing the harbor. It would stand alone through the winter of 2014/2015. On May 1, 2015, two pavilion roofs were erected off of each backside of the clock. One running north and south, the other east and west.

On July 30th at 1:00 P.M. the clock was officially started and has been keeping perfect time since. As of December 5, 2015, a sound system was donated and chimes along with music for the seasons can be heard on the quarter, half, and full hours.

All funding to move and restore the clock was provided by donations from local citizens. A true testament to the attachment locals had with the icon. Over \$30,000 was raised and funds continue to support the beautification of the Ahnapee Trail head area as well as general maintenance, signage, and electricity. There are many local craftsmen and women, construction companies, including Merten's Construction and Concrete, Schlies Construction and Remodeling, Scott's Industrial Coatings, and Northern Sound and Video, government officials and supporters that deserve a great amount of thanks for the volunteer work that was given so graciously! Thank you all so much! This is the world's Tallest Grandfather Clock!

KEWAUNEE PIERHEAD LIGHTHOUSE

The Kewaunee Pierhead Lighthouse is a beloved community icon and a reminder of the local maritime history shared by the early settlers, sailors, and the recreational enthusiasts of today. Still serving as an active aid to navigation, the City of Kewaunee received ownership of the lighthouse from the National Park Service in 2011. Working together with the non-profit "Friends of the Kewaunee Pierhead Lighthouse," restoration is underway!

The first lighthouse in Kewaunee was built in 1889 on the original, wooden North pier. The arrangement of this lighthouse on the pier was changed several times until it was decided a new lighthouse was to be built on a new concrete pier, the new lighthouse being equipped with the most modern equipment.

In 1911 & 1912, the current South pier was built out of concrete. At the end of the pier was built an open frame light tower, with a fog signal building immediately behind it. An elevated walkway was also built along the entire length of the pier to allow the keepers to access the lighthouse safely above the crashing waves. Two 45 h.p. engines inside the building provided compressed air for a 10" diameter chime whistle, sounded in poor visibility. When the new lighthouse was complete in March of 1912, the 5th order Fresnel (fruh-NELL) lens that had lit the old tower on the North pier was moved to the South pier, and the former range lights and steam fog signal building on the wooden North Pier destroyed.

In 1919, electricity was run out to the lighthouse and the light itself electrified. The air compressor engines were replaced with an electric motor, but a

gasoline engine was maintained as a backup. The whistle was replaced by a more modern signal, the "Type F" Diaphone. In November 1930, the lighthouse tower was damaged in a collision from a railroad ferry attempting to enter the harbor. The damaged tower was removed by barge and the current light tower built from the roof of the fog signal building. In 1981, the light was fully automated and the keepers were removed. Shortly after, the elevated walkway was removed as well, and the lighthouse sat nearly abandoned.

After acquiring the lighthouse in 2011, the City of Kewaunee was awarded a state grant in 2015 for the repair of the harbor seawall and the stabilization of the lighthouse. The main focus was to protect the lighthouse structure from the elements and curtail further damage. The initial stabilization took place in 2017 as a massive exterior restoration. Further restoration projects have been completed since, including a new entry door and larger entry platform, installing new windows on the main level, and reinstalling electricity throughout the building.

The 5th Order Fresnel lens, originally installed on the North Pier in 1902, was decommissioned in 2019 and replaced with an LED beacon. The lens is on permanent loan from the Coast Guard and is on display at the Kewaunee History Center.

Kewaunee's square lighthouse, closely resembling the Holland, Michigan Lighthouse, is white with a red roof. The light sits 43 feet above Lake Michigan, and the light characteristic is fixed (or steady) white. The lighthouse spans 5 decks, from the massive fuel oil tanks at the pier level, to the lantern and parapet high above the lake.

The Kewaunee Pierhead Lighthouse is currently undergoing restoration. The lighthouse opens for public tours on selected dates throughout the summer, staffed by volunteers. Suggested donation of \$5/adult and \$3/child.





The story of **Parallel 44** and **Door 44** wineries began in 2005, when husband and wife team, Steve Johnson and Maria Milano planted their first grape vines. For Steve and Maria, wine was a passion that turned into a celebration of the local grape growing and wine making industry. After years of searching for a location with the perfect soil, sun exposure and temperatures for growing grapes, they found the location where Parallel 44 site now sits. In 2005, when Steve and Maria purchased the Parallel 44 location, it was a simple corn field and former gravel pit just east of Green Bay. As soon as they purchased the land, they began to plant vines. A year after the vineyard was planted, in 2006, construction was started on the winery and tasting room for Parallel 44. Since opening on Memorial Day weekend in 2007, Parallel 44 has continued to grow and expand. 


